This certifies that MatchWare MindView 6 falls under the guidelines of compliance for Section 508 Amendment to the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

MindView contains the following feature set:

- **Discerned textually:** A function is textually discernible if it offers text feedback to the user. For example, when a user activates a Delete function, the application may display a confirmation dialog box with text, "Are you sure you want to delete?" Text feedback is accessible to AT.
- Standard Windows Application Shortcuts: Incorporation of standard Windows keyboard shortcuts to control the software.
- Application Programming Interface (API): allows MindView to work in conjunction with text to speech and speech to text tools.
  - Full integration with Nuance software
- **Programmatically exposed**: The point of action (e.g., cursor) is easy to find and is programmatically exposed to AT so that AT can track focus and focus changes.
- User interface element (or program element): All visually available (on screen) information is available to AT. Images, graphs, icons and forms have descriptive information conveyed in a text format such as a text label, ALT tag or "tool tip".
- **Textual information**: Text information is available to AT. This is accomplished by interfacing with operating system functions for displaying text (e.g., APIs that accept text content and attributes).
- Display attributes: product conforms to the user's operating system display settings, and provides
  Map templates that are designed to work in High Contrast Mode.
- **Flashing or blinking element**: Software does not use flashing or blinking text, objects, or other elements having a flash or blink frequency greater than 2 Hz and lower than 55 Hz.
